

RESULTS DAY: A guide to results day for Year 13 students and parents!

This year results day will be held at **La Sainte Union School**.

You can collect your results from **8.00am on Thursday 16th August 2018**.

It is really important that you are around on results day to collect your results – just in case you need to speak with universities or want to pay for results services, such as a remark (see final page).

If you are unable to collect them in person you must do the following:

- **Before results day** – you must bring or email a letter to the LaSWAP office (LaSWAP@williamellis.camden.sch.uk) that states clearly that you give permission for someone else to collect the results on your behalf (they will need to bring official ID with them - such as a driving license).
- Make sure you can be contacted by this person once they have your results
- Have access to the internet so you can check **UCAS Track**
- Be prepared to go through the clearing process on your own (if necessary)
- Contact the relevant exams officer directly for any results services

On results day bring all of the following with you:

- Mobile phone (charged and topped up)
- Results slips from any exams taken last year
- UCAS track details / letters from UCAS and all letters from universities.
- Contact details for your firm and insurance universities (admission tutors)
- A cheque book or cash to pay for any results services you may want

Once you've opened your results...

A. Non university applicants: please complete your destinations card and return on the day.

B. University applicants: there are a few things that could happen

1. You've made your firm offer!_ Congratulations!

Check that your results meet the **exact terms** of your offer. Do this very carefully!

Check UCAS track - this should now show your offer as **UNCONDITIONAL**. This may take a while to update, so don't be too concerned if it doesn't say this straight away. If it hasn't updated by lunchtime, see your Head of Year and phone the university to check that everything is OK.

2. You've missed your firm offer *First of all check UCAS Track.*

- A) Your firm offer *may* still accept you with your missed grades. Congratulations!
- B) If Track *still* shows your offer as conditional **you'll need to phone the university**. They may still be considering your application
- C) If Track says **UNSUCCESSFUL** - they won't accept you on dropped grades.
- D) Re-marks: if you have missed your university offer but are getting your paper re-marked, make sure you communicate with the admissions at the university. They may agree to hold your offer until you get the result of a re-mark.

3. You miss your FIRM offer but meet the requirements of the INSURANCE offer

Check UCAS track. Again, this may take a while to update on UCAS Track. You may like to phone your insurance university to clarify that you're going there. You will also need to change your student loan using the online form.

4. You still require GCSE results as part of your offer

If these form part of an offer, the universities cannot make a decision yet. They will not get your GCSE results automatically - you must contact them and arrange to send / scan and email the result to them so they can assess your results overall.

SEEK ADVICE FROM A MEMBER OF THE SIXTH FORM TEAM IF:

- A. You miss your firm **and** insurance offer (*You will then enter Clearing*)
- B. The university has offered you a different course

This will show up on Track as UCC - ie 'unconditional changed course' - with the new course code.

- C. Your results are much better than the terms of your offers.

You *could* be eligible for the 'Adjustment Period'.

Adjustment

If your exam results turn out to be better than expected and not only meet, but exceed, the conditions of your conditional firm offer, you have the option to use *Adjustment*. This is a scheme that allows you to register and apply for other aspirational courses in a five-day window whilst holding on to a confirmed place. Visit www.ucas.com/adjustment for more information.

Clearing

This will be an option if you have been unsuccessful in gaining a place with either your firm or insurance choices. Because you will deal directly with university admissions staff in *Clearing*, UCAS advises that you should treat the process as a mini interview. Nothing can be gained from a speculative phone call with little or no understanding of the course or university, particularly during Clearing – it is still a competitive process and should be viewed as such. 1. Exam board results service charges 2018

The charges below apply to all LaSWAP students, irrespective of base school and examination board. Requests for results services should be made directly to the exams officer of the school where you sat the exam. All exams officers are available at LSU library on results day morning. Please be aware exams officers will not be able to make any results service applications until **full payment** has been received.

NB The exam boards (and JCQ) have emphasised that there is no 're-mark' service - the review of marking is to ensure that the agreed mark scheme has been applied correctly, reviewers will not re-mark the exam script. Grades will still be amended, where the mark scheme is found to have been applied incorrectly.
